Dr Emily Shuckburgh, British Antarctic Survey / DECC

Dr Emily Shuckburgh is head of the Open Oceans research group at the British Antarctic Survey (BAS). Her research is focused on gaining a better understanding of the dynamics of the atmosphere and oceans to improve predictions of future climate change, and she regularly presents to stakeholder groups on climate change and sustainability. She is also currently on a part time secondment to the UK Government's Dept of Energy and Climate Change.

Prof Tim Palmer, FRS DPhil DSC FRMetS, University of Oxford, ECMWF.

Tim Palmer is Royal Society Research Professor of Climate Physics at Oxford University. Between 2010 and 2012 he was President of the Royal Meteorological Society. During this period he took part in a few high profile debates and discussions on climate change with noted climate "sceptics".

Dr Rosie Robison, Global Sustainability Institute, Anglia Ruskin University

Dr Rosie Robison is a Research Fellow at the Global Sustainability Institute at Anglia Ruskin University. Her current research focuses on science communication and how individuals use scientific information and data to make decisions concerning energy use. She has a background in applied mathematics, and the modelling of fluid flow, including geophysical applications.

Dr Alice Bell, Science and Technology Policy Research, University of Sussex

Dr Alice Bell has just started a new post as research fellow and head of public engagement at the Science Policy Unit at the University of Sussex. She was previously a lecturer in the Science Communication Group at Imperial College, teaching on their MSc in Science Communication and directing an interdisciplinary science in context course for undergraduates exploring issues in energy and climate change. She also writes about science in society issues and writes regularly for the Guardian, Times Higher and Research Fortnight.

Dr Alice Bows, Sustainable Consumption Institute, University of Manchester and Tyndall Centre.

Alice Bows is a Senior Lecturer in Energy & Climate Change at the Sustainable Consumption Institute (SCI), based in the School of Mechanical Civil and Aerospace Engineering, University of Manchester. She has a background in physics and climate modelling, but is now an interdisciplinary researcher focusing primarily on integrating climate change science with wider policy objectives. She currently leads projects at the SCI on climate change mitigation and adaptation in the food system, and an EPSRC project with the Tyndall Centre on decarbonising the shipping sector.
